Re: Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Award

We are excited to offer the Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Award (DofE) to our students this year. The DofE is a great chance for your child to broaden their horizons, discover new interests and talents, have fun with friends, develop essential skills for their future and achieve an internationally renowned Award. As Magna Academy's DofE Manager, I wanted to send you some information about what a DofE programme involves, the benefits for your child and how they can sign up.

The DofE is non-competitive and open to all young people – it is about setting personal challenges and pushing personal boundaries. There are three levels of DofE programme which, when successfully completed, lead to a Bronze, Silver or Gold Award. Through their DofE, students will make friends and memories and build traits like confidence, resilience and self-esteem, which can benefit mental health. They will gain skills and attributes for work and life, like problem-solving, team-working and self-motivation – and they will achieve an award that is recognised by top employers and can help them stand out when applying for university or jobs.

To achieve their Bronze Award, participants must complete four sections: Skills, Volunteering, Physical and their Expedition. Every young person's DofE programme is personal to them – they can choose what they'd like to do for their Skills, Volunteering and Physical sections, and most activities can count. We will provide guidance and support, and students can either choose to continue an activity they already do or discover something completely new.

The Expedition section involves your child working as part of a small team to plan their expedition's aim, choose a location and do some training to make sure they are fully prepared. They will take part in a training expedition, provided by Mountain Ash, covering basic expedition principles and introducing them to expedition equipment. Mountain Ash provide the majority of the equipment, so students will need the appropriate clothing for a walking expedition and a 50+ litre backpack. The qualifying expedition will take place in the summer term and dates for these will follow.

The cost of taking part in the DofE is £235 per participant. This covers your child's participation place and Welcome Pack, which will be sent to their home address and includes their personalised DofE Discount Card. This also includes expedition costs for one training day, a practice expedition of two-days and one night and also the qualifying two-day, one-night expedition.
