INTRODUCTION



In the final weeks of Year 10, students will take part in a number of careers activities that will provide support in making decisions about Post-16 pathways.

We believe it is important to provide comprehensive information at the end of Year 10 ready for decisions to be made in Year 11. Year 11 students need to decide whether to pursue further education in the form of A levels or vocational qualifications; apprenticeships, BTECs or T-Levels. This decision often depends on their academic interests, career aspirations, and preferred learning style. Students should consider subjects that align with their career goals, complement their strengths, and meet the entry requirements for their desired university courses or career paths.

Year 11 students may need to decide whether to attend a college or sixth form for their Post-16 education. Factors such as course offerings, teaching styles, extracurricular activities, and location may influence this decision. Year 11 students often begin exploring potential career paths more seriously. They may research different industries, professions, and job roles to gain a better understanding of the skills, qualifications, and experiences required for their desired careers.

All students have access to Career Pilot to support their careers education. Career Pilot to Career Pilot to also has excellent information for parents/



carers that can be accessed free here. Additionally all students will have a meeting with an independent careers adviser either at the end of Year 10 or in the first two terms of Year 11. These will be arranged during the academy day and all parents/carers get a copy of their child's careers action plan.
