Dear Parent/Carer,

Re: The Doctors Show - Monday 2nd February 2026

I am writing to inform you about details of the upcoming trip to 'The Doctors Show' which your child will be attending on Monday 2nd February.

The Doctors Show is a light-hearted play, which tells the story of Health and Medicine in Britain since the Middle Ages. Using a TV show format, the show brings to life key events and developments in medieval Britain, the Renaissance, the industrial period and modern Britain. The play is in four parts and each part leads to a workshop session that looks at how the events of the play relate to the GCSE History course your child is currently studying and offers advice to students on how to improve performance in the final exams. Consequently, this is a fantastic opportunity for your child to enhance their understanding of the GCSE course.

Students will travel to and from the theatre by coach. They will need to arrive at the academy by 8:15am and meet in the old library. It is essential students do not go to lineups. We will return no later than 2:30pm and students will remain in the school building with teachers, completing the work booklets until the end of the school day. Students are required to bring a packed lunch as refreshments will not be provided at the venue - those who are entitled to free school meals will be provided with a packed lunch from the canteen.

10.00 - 11.05am	The Doctors Show, Part 1 & 2
11.05 - 11.20am	Interval
11.20am - 12.30pm	The Doctors Show, Parts 3 & 4
1.00pm	Departure
2:00 - 2.30pm	Return to school

Students will follow the same uniform **and equipment** expectations as normal - there will be written work activities to be completed at the show.
